The facility itself is purposefully designed as a community convening hub, and will be accessible to community and national veteran organizations, as well as local and state government partners, for the purpose of facilitating programs, trainings, events, and initiatives. The NVRC will include a regional student veterans' resource center, conceived as a one-stop-shop supporting the educational needs of the region's veterans and families. To that end, the NVRC will include classroom spaces to accommodate local and national veteran-focused programming, along with a conference center and 750-seat auditorium suitable to host community activities, lectures, and national



Finally, the NVRC will be designed to include gallery space in which the university's and national storied legacy of serving America's veterans can be put on permanent display – and also as a platform to highlight present-day exhibitions of art, culture, and performance relevant to the veterans' community.

Based on historical precedent and projected opportunity, current estimates suggest that the NVRC will generate more than \$300M in regional economic activity over the next 5 years,

directly support more than 300 high-wage jobs, and indirectly support job creation that will exceed 7,000 jobs over that period. In addition, the event convening capacity created by the NVRC will support increased occupancy rates at CNY hotels and lodging facilities, projected to be 5,000+ hotel nights annually.



### CAPTAIN FLOYD "BEN" SCHWARTZWALDER HALL OF HONOR

Even though he was in his 30s when the U.S. entered WWII, Ben wanted to serve his country. He was he commissioned in the US Army and went to war.

As a captain in the 82nd Airborne (CO of Company G of the 507th), Schwartzwalder earned distinction during the invasion of Normandy and battles that followed in the last days of the war. He played key roles in the capture of the La Fière Causeway and Sainte-Mère-Église, crucial points of entry into France during the D-Day invasion. By the time the 507th reached the battle for Hill 95, they had suffered more than 65% casualties. Schwartzwalder continued his campaign all the way into Germany and acted as military governor of the town of Essen for a period of six months. He was awarded a Silver Star, a Bronze Star, a Purple Heart, four battle stars, Presidential Unit Citation and was promoted to the rank of Major for his actions during the invasion. When he was personally decorated by General Matthew Ridgway, the General said "Ben, I never expected to see you here to receive this award."

Even as a paratrooper, Schwartzwalder remained focused on his football career. He organized an athletic league among the soldiers being assembled in England in preparation for D-Day in order to keep the troops motivated and fit. He coached the 507th PIR football team, leading them through a ten-game season in which the 507th was never defeated and never even scored upon.


Ben's story is one piece of the long and storied history of Syracuse University's committment to the veteran and military community that dates back to World War I. In honor of Ben's commitment, the Hall of Honor in the National Veteran's Resource Center - the space which will tell that history - will bear his name.














